



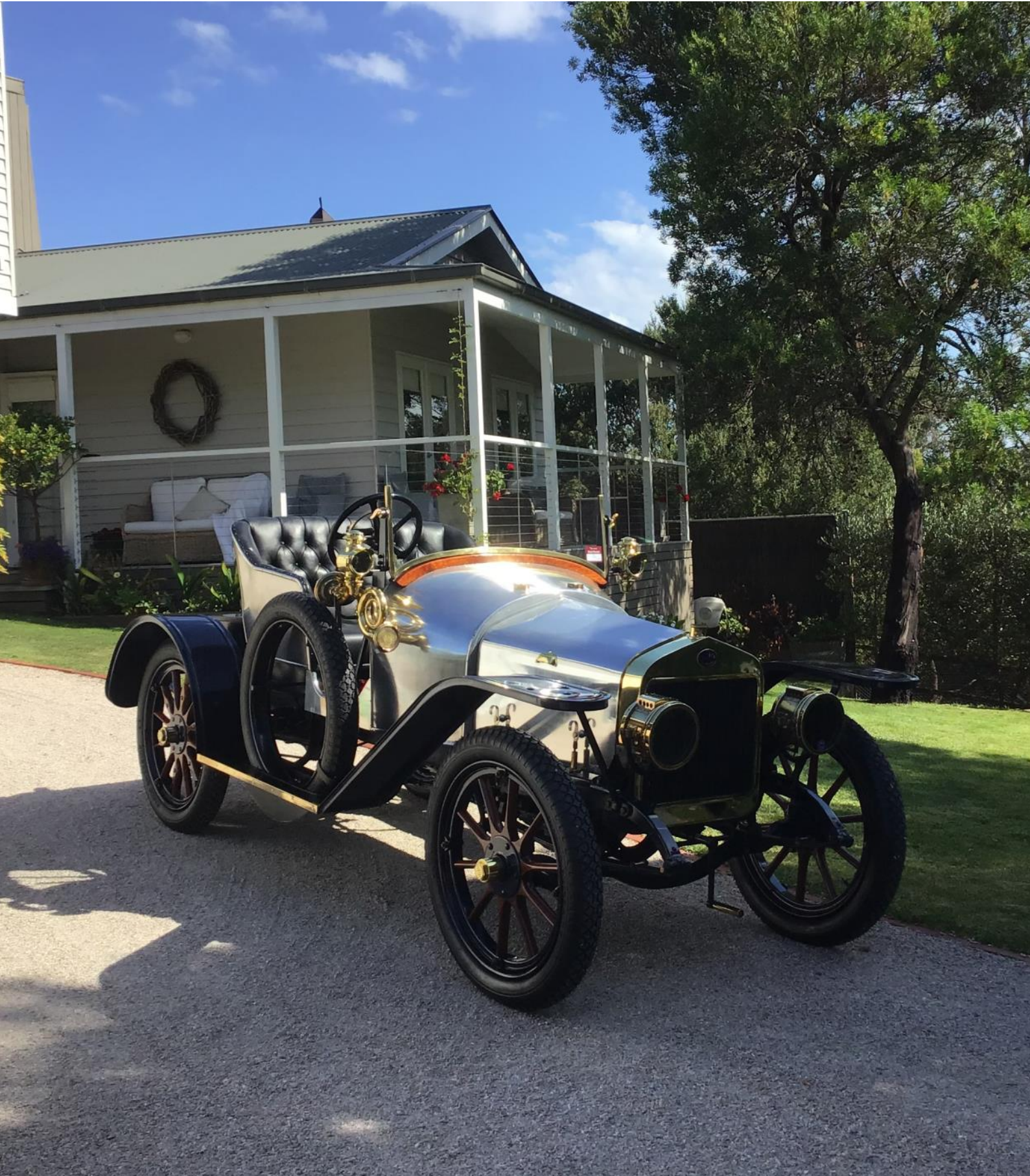

Thank you to Rolf for ably managing our website which has, this year, undergone some changes to improve it.

Finally, thank you to all our committee members who have worked hard during the year to keep the Club rolling along. We are looking forward to 2025 and some new committee members.

Technical & CPS – Barry Smith

Barry Smith has retained the role and has the system buzzing along nicely. All the records are compiled manually and the ability to find details of vehicles and CPS data is very refined and to me quite amazing. The one advantage of a manual system is that it affords maximum security for this sensitive information. There have been 6 new Club Permit Scheme (CPS) vehicles entered onto the Club register this year.

Much of Barry's time is taken up pursuing members to remind them to renew their membership to avoid cancellation of the CPS, or chasing vehicle details like photos etc. Barry & Roz have been involved with the committee in various roles for many years and I along with the club express our heartfelt thanks for their efforts.

Membership – Brian Garrett

CHACA currently has 153 memberships listed. This number shows a decrease from 2023 of 13 members. Fortunately, we have received three new members for the year which assists in reducing the loss of membership numbers.

Unfortunately, a number of those we have lost are members who have deceased during this period. As much as we would desire this not to be a factor, the increasing average age of our membership will continue to play a major part in our membership numbers. The above numbers are the actual membership entries. As some of these entries are joint memberships the actual number of people participating and enjoying the CHACA experience is 225.

Membership renewals were posted in September and the renewals have been arriving at a reasonable rate. As of this date 90 renewals are outstanding. Thank you to the members who have renewed their membership and also returned their renewal forms, either in hard copy or via email, which makes the Membership Secretary's job much easier in keeping the database up to date.

Property - Eddie Reynolds

Property wise, CHACA has a Club Trailer that is fully equipped for any kind of Club outing, be it for our regular Hot Cross bun event, or for any other Club outing such as an Annual Tour, picnics, or Display Day, Cruden Farm for instance. It boasts a very large gas pie warmer that can handle well over a hundred hot cross buns in one sitting. Also in the trailer are 2 gas burners for hot water and all the usual requisites for any event ... kettles, cutlery, cups, rubbish bins, Club banners, gazebo, the list goes on. Also, in stock and for sale are CHACA ball point pens, Club badge memorabilia, car bumper badges etc. Being a non profit organisation, we are eligible for purchasing all sorts of chocolates from Cadburys at a very reasonable rate and these are passed on to members, also at a very reasonable rate.

Our Club library is another asset and is subject to review as it does not currently receive much interest from members. There are a lot of valuable workshop manuals up there, but most members have their own anyway and the current interest is with more modern vehicles.

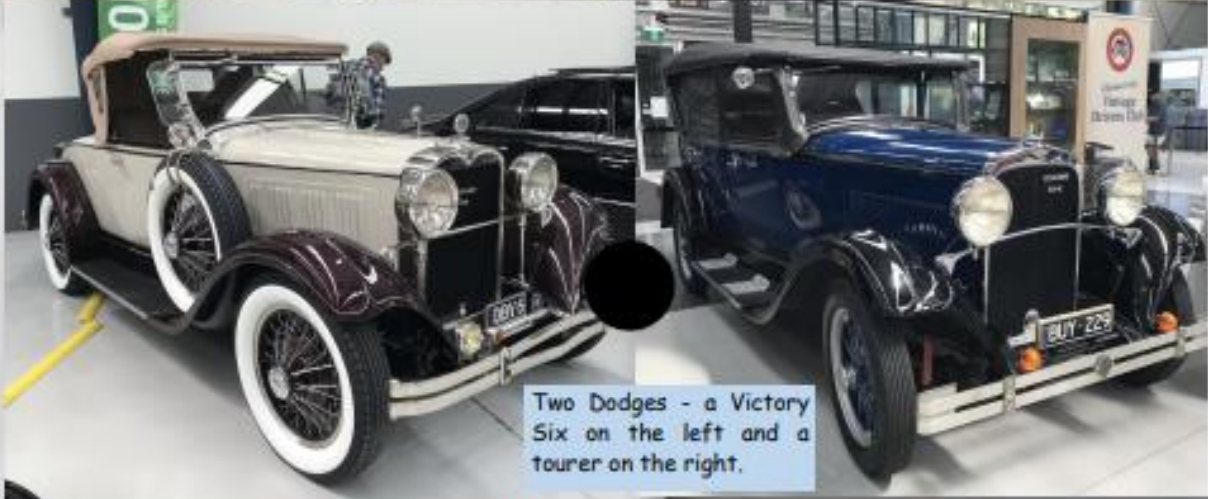

CHACA CLUB PERMIT SCHEME ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

CHACA is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS).

VicRoads has set rules to determine the eligibility of vehicles for the Club Permit Scheme. These may be viewed in the CPS handbook or on the VicRoads website. CHACA has set its own additional requirements for vehicles to be submitted for the CPS using CHACA's authorisation. The additional requirements are in line with the original CHACA charter of vehicle originality and preservation.

The following are CHACA's requirements for Members submitting vehicles for CPS assessment.

1. The vehicle must have been manufactured prior to 31st December 1992.
2. Vehicles submitted for CPS application must be as the manufacturer originally designed and built. Some modifications are permitted in line with the original manufacture option list, are period correct, or are based on safety issues, but in all cases must not detract from originality. Replicas derived from a lower model are acceptable as long as the appearance is as original as possible to the intended vehicle model (e.g. GT Falcon from a base Falcon).
3. Applicants for the CPS will certify that the vehicle submitted will remain roadworthy during the permit period and unmodified from what was originally submitted.
4. Once a vehicle has been accepted by CHACA for CPS it will be the members' responsibility to maintain the vehicle as originally presented, with no further modifications and in a roadworthy condition for all permit renewal applications.
5. Determination of the eligibility for any vehicle submitted to CHACA for CPS will be at the discretion of the Committee. Vehicle CPS application must be submitted to the Technical Officer in writing.

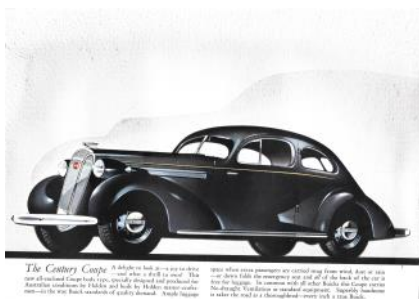
